UNCOVERING THE READING PROCESS

Reading is a thinking process, effective readers know that when they read what they read is supposed to make sense. In order to do this effectively we employ sub-skills which go beyond simply skimming and scanning texts. This session explores what expert readers do when they read in L1 and challenges teachers to apply this in planning their own reading lessons for students who are reading in L2. Exploring what you as an expert reader does, perhaps unthinkingly, as well as how to decode a challenging reading text enables teachers to be better prepared to explicitly teach reading sub skills. The session also explores how we can design a lesson with the aim of explicitly modelling & teaching reading skills and strategies.

ESP TRAINING AND TEACHER DEVELOPMENT: CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS

Although ESP and EGP are highly interrelated, teaching the former is frequently believed more challenging. As ESP instruction primarily aims to prepare learners to communicate in the tasks prescribed by their field of study or work, teaching in this area frequently includes a range of tasks which require additional knowledge and skills. Apart from classroom instruction, it involves analysing learner needs, investigating specialist discourse and writing materials. The aim of this talk is to identify and address the challenges that teachers may encounter in the process of delivering ESP instruction and developing in teaching English for Specific Purposes.

EMPOWERING LEARNERS BY GENERATING CRITERIA FOR ASSESSING "GOOD WRITING"

I will propose a theoretical and practical framework for how to train ourselves (and our students) to read critically in a way that generates criteria and heuristics for what constitutes "good writing" and which can then be used to assess and evaluate our own writing, thus empowering learners (both teachers and students) with the ability to reliably measure the progress and improvement in their communication skills in the absence of feedback from others. Participants will then workshop an article from which they will generate criteria and heuristics for the writing of their own original essay that can be self-assessed.

Wordless picture books and animations are an excellent resource for the teachers of young children. For centuries people have conveyed meaning through images, without the help of words. Through wordless picture books and animations, teachers can make students more active and engaged, encouraging them to tell stories or make stories of their own. Thus, wordless books and animations can promote language development and critical thinking. In this talk, we will examine why wordless picture books and animations should be used in the class and how we can use them to help children develop their language skills, as well as their creativity.

YOUBOOK FOR NON-EXPERTS FROM SCRATCH

21st-century teachers do not only teach the subject of their expertise but also train the students for employability skills. However, in the research literature, these skills are mostly presented theoretically.
